Garage Sale and BBQ on July 4th!!!

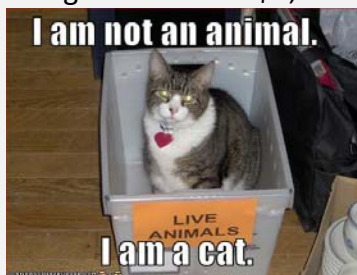

Thank you for helping Holly Hill!

Holly Hill is a ten week old kitten who, unfortunately, was diagnosed with a serious congenital eye disease in the beginning of June.

At that time we were told by the vet who was treating Holly Hill that she might need to have both of her eyes removed and since most vets would find it unethical to remove both eyes from a young kitten, euthanasia was recommended.

True to our firm position on not euthanizing any animal suffering from a survivable illness, we did not want to take this drastic step and started a campaign to save Holly Hill.

The campaign was very successful and it enabled us to take her to an ophthalmic vet for treatment and medication.

In early May, an ACA volunteer arrived at a local municipal shelter to pick up several kittens that were no longer able to stay there.

Several hours prior, an uncaring owner had literally dumped a small family of kittens in a sealed cardboard box outside this shelter in a 30°C weather. Sadly, two of the kittens died of heat exhaustion before they were discovered.

Their odyssey did not end there - once inside, it was determined that the kittens would be euthanized since they were only five weeks old and the shelter staff would not be able to handle

kittens that were not yet fully weaned.

Upon arriving at the shelter for the other kittens, the ACA volunteer was asked if she could also take this family. Seeing them try to press their small faces through the bars of the cage out of hunger and terror, the volunteer decided that she could not leave them behind to die. With only 45 minutes to spare before they were set to be euthanized, they joined twelve other little ones as part of a 16-kitten rescue!

Since arriving in foster care, these stunning kittens have

thrived on the attention and good food provided to them by their foster mommy, who literally woke every four hours around the clock to bottle feed them special formula from a tiny bottle.

They are happy & healthy, and super-social with true "puppy-dog" personalities.
